## MATCH PLAY

## Tournament Description

All of the matches for the Cup are played under Match Play Rules. The result of each Match is determined by the number of holes won. Eligibility: In order to 'Comptete for the Cup', players must be a student, past student. parent, past parent, current employee or teacher of either Carver Elementary or Valentine Elementary school in San Marino. "Singles" is a match in which one player from each school competes against each other. At the end of the match, the player who has more points wins I point for their school. Whichever school has more points at the end of all of the matches, wins the Cup.

Handicaps will be in effect for those with SCGA handicaps. A player wins the Match when he is up by more points than there are holes remaining to play. Singles Match play pits Player A against Player B, hole after hole. If Player A scores a 4 on the first hole while Player B scores a 5, Player A wins the hole (I point). If player A is a 5 handicap and player B from the opposing team is a 7 handicap, player B will get an extra stroke on the #1 and #2 handicapped holes. At Oak Valley that would be holes 7 and 18. If at the end of the match both players are tied, each side scores a half-point for their team. Ties are called 'halves' and are not played off.

If a player does not have a registered handicap but would like to participate and meets the above eligibility requirements, there will be a 'Modified Callaway' entry. Modified Callaway for this Tournament will be 9 random holes that will be used to calculate the points for the match. After playing hole 1, the players will go to hole 2. At hole 2, there will be information that will indicate whether or not hole I counted towards the point total. And so on.

Everyone is encouraged to play. This is a Fundraising event for our Elementary Schools. You do not have to compete for the Cup in order to be a part of the golf day. The only prize that will be awarded will be the Carver Valentine Ryder Cup trophy. Additionally, those who do not meet the above listed eliqibility requirements will not be playing in the competitive part of the Tournament.

## PAIRINGS

Each school will have a representative that will submit a roster and then be involved in the 'Pairings'. 'Pairings' will be based on handicaps for those with handicaps or the players normal score for the Callaway portion.
